Britain's history is not as universally reviled as, for example, the history of my country of birth. You know it as Teutonia, Krautenheim, Tankland – where the Huns roam free, guzzling beer, winning football games, praying to the almighty Bratwurst.

Germans can not go back in time and have their poll smoked by misty-eyed, gold-plated history – which is what you seem to do every single time the going gets tough: Rule Britannia, Stiff Upper Lip, Keep Calm And Carry On – those are slogans as beaten up as eleven lions were against mighty Iceland. Fine, I will lend you a hand, one finger at a time. You do have more recent history to actually be proud of:

- Indian Famine, 1896/97:

- Great Famine, 1876–78:

The [1875](#) world population was 1.35 billion. Under British rule, 10 million people, 0.74% of the entire world perished in this famine. The death toll in 2024 numbers would be 60 million.

On the orders of Lord Lytton, crops were exported, and a sub-continent prone to famines was thrown into another British-made catastrophe.

The Shoah left a bone-chilling and mind-blowing 6,000,000 Jewish people dead. Adding 250,000 victims from operations such as “Aktion T4”, and all 73,000,000 dead from WW II, the death toll at the hands of the Nazis, in 2024 numbers, is 279.1 million.
